TODAY'S TREASURE

Showcasing some of the most incredible pieces in David Roche's collection with thoughts from his friend, Martyn Cook. While our gallery is closed, we will start by looking at pieces currently displayed in the *Flowers: Passion. Pain. Nation.* exhibition.

Secretaire abattant, c. 1765-70, attributed to Nicolas-Jean Marchand, France, kingwood, lacquer, gilt bronze, breche d'alep marble

"David thought this secretaire was so incredibly beautiful with its cascading carnations and their fronds, and he adored the Chinoiserie style of it. The quality is exceptional and the condition of the lacquer is extraordinarily beautiful. At one point it was attributed to Delanois, since then it has been reattributed to Marchand. It stands and has always stood in the Yellow Drawing Room. He often filled the cabinet inside with French porcelain or inkstands."

Did you know...

David Roche was the first non-British judge at Cruft's Dog Show, the preeminent dog show in the United Kingdom. He attended the show on the 7th and 8th Feburary 1969, and judged Best in Show.



You can still see David's invitation letter in the Roman room at Fermoy House.

David later said it made him as many enemies as it did friends, as he judged on merit rather than on connection, which displeased some of those showing!


